1. Which article did you choose to respond to? Summarize that article and the points made by the writer. The article I chose to respond to is "Casual Homophobia in Taiwan." The main idea of this article is that people see Taiwan as a progressive place, but there is still casual homophobia here. For example, the author wrote that two common insults on Taiwanese school grounds (and even society in general) is "死 gay" (si gay) and "娘娘腔" (niang niang qiang), which mean "a fucking gay" or "sissy". This shows that people still has some stereotype on gay people. The author interviewed a number of individuals, and asked for their personal stories as examples. Their stories show that homophobia exists at school and in the workplace.
